

## The Commentary

Write your commentary for someone else to read about you and what you are modeling. This should be written in the third person. Also, it should describe what you are wearing, not your other projects and activities. If you used a pattern for your outfit, look at the back of the pattern. It will help with a lot of descriptive words about what you have made. Also talk about where you intend to wear it or what you will use it for (if you have made an apron). Have your sewing leader read it over before submitting it!
